

Old Business:

Dredging Park Lake and repairing the dam were discussed.

New Business:

Councilman T. Mulligan explained the move from a Recreation Commission to a Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee. The Recreation Director will report directly to the Mayor and Council. Someone from the committee should attend the Mayor and Council meetings to get approvals. The Mayor and Council must approve spending money from the Recreation Trust Fund. Discussion followed.

Councilman Mulligan said this is the last meeting as a Recreation Commission and each Recreation Commissioner must apply for appointment to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee. The appointments will be for two years and he hopes all the Recreation Commissioners will submit paperwork to continue. There can be up to eleven people on the committee. Their appointments will be approved at the Mayor and Council reorganization meeting.
