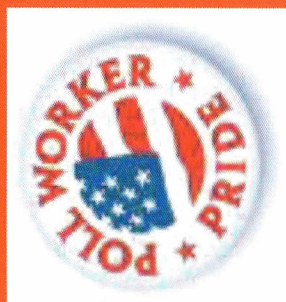

What does it mean to be a Poll Worker?

President Abraham Lincoln said that our government is a "government of the people, by the people, for the people". As a Poll Worker you are upholding these words by choosing to invoke your right as a citizen to ensure that the election process is upheld. It's a big responsibility and we thank you for your service!

What is a Poll Worker?

Poll Workers are the people who ensure the conduct of fair and accurate elections. They prepare the district by setting up voting equipment, greeting voters, verify registrations and providing voters with appropriate ballots. At the end of the day, Poll Workers close the precinct and prepare election materials for delivery or actually deliver the material to the Elections office.

Can I be a Poll Worker?

Typically Poll Workers are required to be a registered voter in the district or county where that they are serving. State and local voter registration rules vary on allowing college students who live at school to register to vote using their school address. Some states have recently changed their rules to allow college students to work the polls near their school even if they are not registered to vote in that jurisdiction. Morris County welcomes college students to join the ranks of our poll workers.

How do I apply to become a Poll Worker?

Please contact the Board of Elections at **973-285-8350** for information to determine if you qualify to be a Poll Worker and for application. What should I expect if I am a selected as a Poll Worker?

If selected as a Poll Worker you should expect to attend a training session that typically lasts a couple of hours. If you are not going to be working at your own polling place you should expect to request an absentee ballot. Plan to go to sleep early on the Monday before election day, because you have to be at the polls at 5:15 AM and stay until after it closes (often after 8:00 p.m.).

Poll Worker Eligibility Includes:

- You must be register to vote in Morris County
- You must be at least 18 years old
- You must have your own transportation
- For Poll Workers convenience they can vote Absentee Ballot
